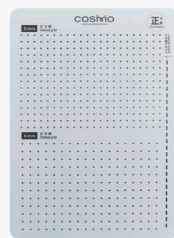

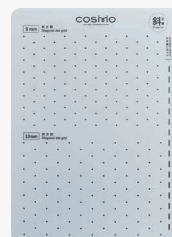

### For even marking of sashiko and stitching.

This Sashiko template can be used to make  
stitches evenly along the holes.  
A detailed variation is provided for each 1mm to  
draw your ideal pattern.  
It can be also smocking embroidery, cross-stitch  
drafting and many other situations.





## Sashiko can be done on a variety of fabrics



- 1 Stitching on a commercially available bag
- 2 Create an original arrangement by adding a sashiko stitch to a dishcloth .
- 3 Reinforcing a denim shirt whose fabric has become thinner with sashiko
- 4 Arrange envelopes with paper embroidery

## Since it is a grid dot, there are many ways to use it.



The wide variety of hole spacing allows for ideal patterns.



The basic grid dots of the Sashiko allow you to create variety of patterns.

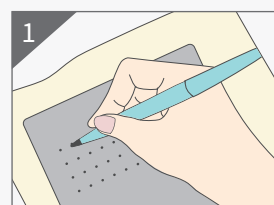


Decorate with thread

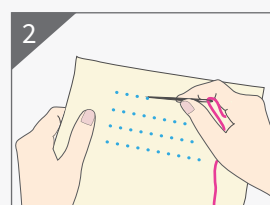


With stitch guide arrange the shirt

### How to Use



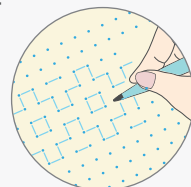
Overlay the template on the cloth, mark the area to be embroidered.



Stitch using the mark as a guide.

#### Point

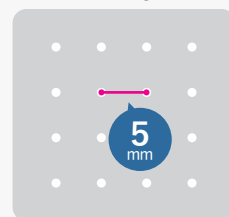
For complicated patterns, connect the marks before stitching to avoid mistakes.



### Two types of hole arrangement

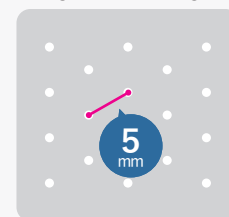
\* Example of 5mm dotted grid

#### Dotted grid



The holes are arranged evenly at 90° angles both vertically and horizontally.

#### Diagonal dot grid



The holes are lined up at a 30° angle.

### Template Features



1

Thin sheet makes it easy to mark.



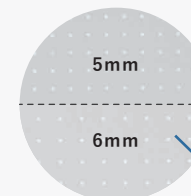

The light grey sheet makes it easy to see the holes.

Small holes help you mark accurately.

Two different pitches by 1 mm on one sheet.

You can see the fabric underneath as the sheet are translucent.
